WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE CARE OF CREATION
WEEK COMMENCING 1<sup>ST</sup> SEPTEMBER 2024

It is easy for us to criticise the Pharisees, they are distant from us in time and 'other', so 'they' make a simple target. Are we justified in this? No. In today's Gospel Jesus does criticise what they do which is not the same as condemning them as persons. We must remember that on the Cross Jesus prayed for those persecuting him, 'forgive them Father they know not what they do'. As always we need to distinguish between judging a person and judging their actions. though the two are clearly linked. The question then arises, how do we look at ourselves? Do we ignore or dismiss our sinful deeds as not very serious/nothing to worry about/God will forgive me in any case? There is a real danger of becoming Catholic Pharisees if we are not careful, relying on outward rituals and ready to judge others as not meeting our standards. The renewal of the liturgy after Vatican II is test, does a person accept the authority of the church to make changes in liturgical matters or do they make the personal judgment that the old rites (which got their standing from the Church!) are better?
