Many events from both the Old and New Testaments are connected to today's feast of the Presentation. In itself it refers back to the escape of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt. The last of the ten plagues, the one to which Pharaoh finally responded, was the death of the first-born of the Egyptians and certain of their animals. The Israelites themselves were Passed Over by the Angel of Death because of the blood of the sacrificial lambs. In recognition of the suffering of the Egyptians, God ordained that henceforth every first-born son of the Israelites should be redeemed, again by a sacrifice. Also, of course, Jesus is to become the true Lamb of the real Passover, the Eucharist. We see sacrifice everywhere. not uselessly but a reminder that all of human history if within God's providence such that all of history is really sacred history. The death of the Egyptians wasn't pointless. Even the Passover lambs gain a meaning. Fr Chris
