The miracle of the loaves: The story of the multiplication of the loaves and the fishes has beguiled painters, theologians down the centuries. It speaks a spiritual truth, let us take one aspect. It was evening; one disciple came to Jesus and said, *'This is a lonely place, so send the people away ... to buy themselves some food'*. Jesus says, *'There is no need for them to go away but give them something to eat yourselves'* (Mt:14:15). Our human nature instinctively provides a quick solution, to scatter and send the crowds away. Jesus came as a great gathering force, and his mission was to draw all people to himself and feed them.

We often dismiss troublesome people: the foreigner, homeless, hungry away who don't fit in. However, the follower of Jesus, the gatherer, ought to bring precisely such people close. Provide by giving the little that they have and then watch as the Lord multiplies their gifts.

Just consider the number of ministries that reach out to the poor. How wonderful to be part of the story that the Lord never tires of multiplying the loaves and the fishes!

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Despite all the restrictions, let us be thankful that we can once again gather together, despite social distancing, as God's people.

Please note the following norms in order to promote a COVID 19 safe environment :-

- ◆ Weekend masses need to be booked in advance
- ◆ Churches will open 20 minutes before start of Mass as it will take longer than normal to enter the church, please make allowances
- ◆ Entrance to Church will be via the main door, exit by the side door
- ◆ Hand sanitiser is available at entrance and exit, though you may bring your own
- ◆ It will be essential that people sit where they are asked and do not move from there
- ◆ An Offertory Collection will be taken at each mass with 'collection bags' available on entry and exit; the donation station is also useable
- ◆ No touching of Statues or Images in Church
- ◆ Toilets will be closed except for genuine emergencies.
- ◆ The use of face covering is not obligatory but recommended by the NHS

**THE PARISH STEWARDS ARE HERE TO HELP AND DIRECT YOU TO YOUR SEAT(S), PLEASE BE POLITE TO THEM AS THEY CAN ASK YOU TO LEAVE THE CHURCH IF YOU DO NOT COMPLY WITH PRESENT GOVERNMENT AND DIOCESAN REGULATIONS.**
