

TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (B) **EDUCATION SUNDAY** WEEK COMMENCING 8TH SEPTEMBER 2024

Today's Gospel tells the story of Jesus healing a man who was deaf and could barely speak. Jesus leads the man away from the crowd, showing a personal connection to him. He touches the man's ears and tongue, using simple, symbolic gestures to express His care and understanding of the man's struggle. When Jesus says "Ephphatha", meaning "Be opened", the man is not just physically healed; he also experiences a deeper spiritual renewal, an experience he could not keep to himself alone but published it everywhere. This passage serves as a reminder that true openness involves not only physical hearing and speech but also a willingness to listen to God's word and share it with others. Our hearts are opened every Sunday to the mysteries of the Holy Eucharist and word of God. We are expected, at the end of each Mass, to take the message of Christ to the world and to witness His love to the world.
