I was in the National Museum of Scotland last summer and noticed an exhibit of the oldest colour television in the world, from 1946. It is a large, primitive looking machine and I found it difficult to imagine what watching it would be like.

There are now Catholic television channels like EWTN where Mass is broadcasted as well as the Divine Mercy Chaplet and lots of interesting programmes about faith. The Vatican has a radio station: I was surprised to find out that it was set up in 1931! The Church has always made use of modern developments to evangelise. Sometimes we can look at the things we use everyday and decide if we can use them to spread the faith too. A mobile phone cover with a religious theme used to download a faith podcast, or our work computer with a religious piece of art as a screensaver can be a good conversation starter about our relationship with the Lord. I remember seeing cars with the Christian symbol of a fish on them or a rosary hanging from a rear view mirror.

God really is present in every aspect of our lives - the 20th Century mystic, Teilhard de Chardin wrote, 'God is not remote from us. He is at the point of my shovel, my paint brush, my sewing needle - and [in] my heart and thoughts.' Let us celebrate God in every aspect of our lives, including our technology. Praise him!
