Remembrance Sunday

Week Commencing 10th November 2024

The widow of Zarephath in the first reading and the widow in the gospel exemplify true generosity and profound trust in Gods ability to provide for us. Despite her dire circumstances, the Zarephath woman obeys the prophet Elijah and shares her meal. She shares with the prophet the last she and her son had to eat. Her selfless generosity leads to the multiplication of her oil and flour as promised by the prophet. In the same vein, the widow in the gospel, despite her poverty, offers all she had to live on. She gave little but was valued by Jesus, who recognised her and praised her generosity above that of others who put in much more. Both passages emphasise that true generosity is measured not in terms of the amount or quantity given by the spirit of the giver. It is through giving that we receive even more.
