It's just over a fortnight since we celebrated Christmas and here we are at the Baptism of the Lord. That's a period of about thirty years in Jesus' life. John the Baptist has also grown up, his parents Elizabeth and Zechariah have almost certainly died. St. Joseph is probably dead also, while Mary is in her late forties. We might wonder what happened to the shepherds and wise men. One can see how tempting it is to 'fill in the gaps' as some false writings from the early centuries try to do and they can linger on as inaccurate folk memories. The silence about these early years of Jesus' life can tell us something. The important point, surely, is that Jesus lived a normal life. In effect he is sanctifying daily life in the sense that nothing miraculous happened (Mary might have had something to say otherwise). When life for us seems humdrum and routine we can yearn for excitement, seeking fame perhaps. The silent years of Jesus' life can help us temper those urges. We can also note that a 'normal' life for a Catholic is really pretty extraordinary as we love God and neighbour in the Holy Spirit.
