THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER (B) Week commencing 14th April 2024

We often find in the readings at this season, a call to repent. This word has the sense of a change of direction. We can illustrate this by imagining someone is out walking in the countryside and gradually comes to realise they are lost. Anxiety levels would likely increase, along with a search for the right path, and possibly self-recrimination over one's mistakes. If the right path is found, what a relief. The past is forgotten and the walker confidently yet carefully goes forward, focussed on their destination. So it is with us and sin. We shouldn't sin, yet we do. We are invited to repent, go back to the right path and move forward. Dwelling on our faults, beating ourselves up, is generally not a good idea; it would be like our imaginary walker standing still and berating themselves for getting lost, rather than moving on. St. Paul asks us to throw off the sin that clings so easily and keep running forward, good apostolic advice.

NEXT SECOND COLLECTION: The Fourth Sunday of Easter is known as **Vocations Sunday** (**Good Shepherd Sunday**), and is marked as the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. The purpose of this day is to fulfil Jesus' instruction to "*Pray the Lord of the harvest to send labourers into his harvest*" (Matthew 9:38). While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates her attention on raising up shepherds for God's people - vocations to Holy Orders (the priesthood and diaconate) and to the religious life - while encouraging all who are discerning their vocation to pray more earnestly that they may hear and respond to God's call. There will be a 2nd collection taken for Promotion of Vocations on 21st April 2024. Please take a prayer cards which are available in Church porch.

BAPTISMS: A Godparent must be fully initiated in the Catholic Church. This means they have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation. You only need one Godparent. It does not matter if they are male or female. If you choose two Godparents, traditionally a male and female that meet the requirements for Godparents. There is no provision for more than two godparents.
