FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME(B)

WEEK COMMENCING 14TH JULY 2024

St. Paul, in the passage from Ephesians, uses the word, 'freedom' twice. We might note the difference between 'freedom from' and 'freedom to'. 'Freedom from' refers to whatever might hold us back from some kind of action. In some cases this might literally be a physical restraint or limitation. St. Paul points out the freedom we gain through the forgiveness of sins, a freedom from. We may be slow to appreciate the way in which sinful habits bind us or at least inhibit our freedom of response, but the limitations are real. We also have other kinds of limitations, especially psychological wounds e.g. emotional memories which colour our outlook and reduce our freedom. 'Freedom to' generally refers to possibilities which lie before us and I think St. Paul's second use of 'freedom' is more of this type. He is referring to the gift of the Holy Spirit, in other words grace to act well. We need both freedom from our sins and freedom to act graciously.


