Evangelii Gaudium Sunday

WEEK COMMENCING 15TH SEPTEMBER 2024

A key point in Martin Luther's theology was/is, 'faith alone', good works don't count towards salvation. He believed, wrongly, that the Catholic church teaches that our own good works add something missing from faith. He really didn't like the letter of St. James and wanted it thrown out of the Bible along with the books of the Old Testament that he had already rejected. His followers persuaded him that messing with the New Testament was a step too far and the letter remains as a clear rebuke to Luther's ideas. St. James is not arguing that we earn our way into heaven, winning points by doing good, he is pointing out the need for a conversion of life as Jesus himself says time and again. A true, living faith must result in precisely that, a living faith which is expressed in a person's words and deeds. The passage we hear today is crystal clear, living faith leads to action. We might recall a question often used in youth work, 'If you were accused of being a Christian would there be enough evidence to convict you? '. A final observation about Luther's position, is it not ironic that so many of the protestants who follow his ideas end up doing precisely what he disliked, the famous protestant work ethic?

It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things." - 1 Corinthians 13:4-7. A successful marriage requires falling in love many times, always with the same person.
