The Bible often uses images taken from the natural world about us, and Jesus in particular developed this approach in his parables. Trees, vines, wheat etc are useful as images, being familiar to most people and capable of various 'uses' in preaching. We might think about the mustard seed, not the one we use in cooking but a much smaller seed. It contains within itself what is needed to produce a mustard tree, yet depends on water etc from outside to get going and thrive. This image works regardless of biological knowledge, we don't need to have discovered DNA. The tree itself grows in a determined way, it doesn't become an oak. Also, the tree takes material to itself. The Church grows from the seed of faith of the Apostles, it depends always on God's grace, it must remain faithful to the Apostolic faith (otherwise it has become something else) and it takes to itself new members who become branches etc
