

PENTECOST SUNDAY

Week Commencing 19th May 2024



The account of the first Pentecost in Acts is dramatic and therefore memorable, even lapsed Christians probably remember the tongues of fire. We might find ourselves asking why the presence of the Holy Spirit doesn't seem to be so dramatic nowadays; for example, Confirmation Masses are joyful but not usually marked with pyrotechnics. I would suggest we consider the change of circumstances and therefore manifestation. The first Pentecost, and the subsequent one with Cornelius and his household, marked the beginning of the Catholic Church's mission. The continued existence of the Catholic Church is itself a sign of the Spirit, despite the fallibility of individual members. Since then the Church has grown and the presence of the Holy Spirit is seen in other ways St. Paul gives us an idea of the fruits of the Spirit, seen in the lives of countless Christians., and surely we can point to the Saints as well. Thus, from the earliest days (St. Stephen) up to the present there has been a cloud of witnesses to the faith, not all canonised yet each in their own way demonstrating the presence of the Spirit in their lives, each can be seen as a flame. The one Catholic Church also preaches the Gospel throughout the world in a multitude of languages, continuing Pentecost in that way also.
