## SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C) WEEK COMMENCING 20<sup>TH</sup> FEBRUARY 2022

One of the more striking characteristics of the society in which we live today is the readiness to condemn others, along with a refusal to forgive. The contrast with this Sunday's readings could not be clearer, which tells us how far society is now removed from the Gospel, if we needed any more proof. It does mean that society is revealed as fundamentally violent, with people constantly on the look out for others to condemn. The corollary is that the same people will always be on the alert to defend themselves from the attacks of others. No wonder that Jesus brings us a peace the world cannot give, because there is no real peace in the world. The most perfect example of Jesus' words is given by himself, when he undergoes the Passion. On the Cross he 'soaks up' all the hatred and violence of mankind, refusing to respond in kind but instead saying, 'Forgive them Father, they know not what they do.' Each of us is asked to imitate Jesus in that attitude, which is of course the same thing as saying we are asked to live in true charity with others, a charity which is a gift from God himself. We are likely to get the same condemnation from many in society, which is why Jesus asks us to take up our cross daily. Our parish, however, is called to be a place of true peace so we must strive to live the words of today's readings, in charity with one another. Fr.Chris
