### <mark>TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (B)</mark> WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

A very common reason for people rejecting God despite having been brought up in the faith is suffering. The suffering is usually something physical, often a death, and some people blame God for not doing enough in their eyes. In this type of situation the one who has suffered or is suffering is generally deemed to be innocent (not true, we've all sinned) and therefore the suffering is unjustified. Another scenario is when a person believes they have fulfilled their side of a bargain with God (saying prayers, going to Mass etc) but God has failed to uphold his commitment (which he never made in the first place). Jesus never promised his disciples a life free from suffering, he asked them to do the opposite by taking up their crosses. Jesus was truly innocent yet chose the path of suffering in order to redeem suffering. Suffering without the Cross doesn't make sense, but with the Cross and Resurrection we can see beyond this life to the fullness of life, with Jesus. We must not restrict our vision to this world only
