

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS

Week commencing 21st April 2024

Biblically a name is more than just a label. In the Old Testament we often find the meaning of names being explained, and also name changes e.g. Abram to Abraham, Jacob to Israel and so on. God himself has dozens of names given to him. At the Annunciation the angel Gabriel (God is my strength) tells Mary the name of the son to be born of her, Jesus, a name which means God Saves. We are baptised in the name of the three Persons of the Trinity and we remind ourselves of this when we make the sign of the Cross. Jesus is a name that saves because it is God in Jesus who does truly save us. We might also recall the second commandment, Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord your God in vain, to misuse it. So let us honour the name of Jesus, unlike the blasphemers around us, and recognise him as our Lord and Saviour.

**SECOND COLLECTION:** After all Masses this weekend a 2<sup>nd</sup> collection will be taken for Vocations Sunday (Good Shepherd Sunday). This is marked as the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. The purpose of this day is to fulfil Jesus' instruction to "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send labourers into his harvest" (Matthew 9:38). While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates her attention on raising up shepherds for God's people - vocations to Holy Orders (the priesthood and diaconate) and to the religious life - while encouraging all who are discerning their vocation to pray more earnestly that they may hear and respond to God's call.

**BAPTISMS:** A Godparent must be fully initiated in the Catholic Church. This means they have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation. You only need one Godparent. It does not matter if they are male or female. If you choose two Godparents, traditionally a male and female that meet the requirements for Godparents. There is no provision for more than two godparents.
