

Wisdom is mentioned throughout the Bible and indeed a significant part of the Old Testament is entitled Wisdom Literature. Jesus, for example, teaches that those who listen to his words and act on them are wise, like someone building their house on rock not sand. We might distinguish wisdom from prudence. The prudent person is principally concerned with the present or near future, avoiding mistakes while choosing a good course of action. Wisdom is generally considering the wider picture, more long term. We could say that wisdom is seen in choosing the true perspective on life as a whole, it discerns the meaning of life. The two go together, prudence is practical wisdom, putting into practice what is in accord with the wisely grasped. Faith reveals that true wisdom is knowing, loving and serving God in this life. Foolishness is not a matter of stupidity, fools can be very intelligent, it is failing to heed the Gospel message of salvation, not recognising what our time here on earth is for. Fr. Chris
