Every human being has within them a need, desire, to be liked. Arguably, this is a result of the Fall because such a need works against the dynamic of true charity. In today's Gospel, Jesus sketches out some of that dynamic of charity, it is something which focusses on the good of the other. The need to be liked focusses on self and how comfortable we feel, and in particular it easily leads to compromise on values, standards etc, as we sacrifice them in order to be liked. We commonly find people who dedicate themselves, partly unconsciously perhaps, to seeking praise from others, being liked. Enemies then become a challenge, as they clearly don't like 'us', and it is easiest to turn away from them as a result. Charity instead looks at what is good for them, regardless of their real or apparent dislike of 'us'. Jesus gives us the perfect example of charity, dying to save us despite the fact that we are all sinners, people who have rejected God in those sins. If God were to be kind only to those who liked him perfectly, heaven would likely remain empty.
