



SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER (9)

Week Commencing 25th May 2025

One thread running through the readings this Sunday would be, I suggest, the idea of home. In the first reading, from the Acts of the Apostles, we have the account of how the early church welcomed those of non-Jewish birth as members, a pivotal moment. We could say that these converts found a home in the church. The second reading shifts in time to the end of days, the completion of the church. The first Jerusalem had been the dwelling place of God on earth, the heavenly Jerusalem is revealed as the true home of the glorified church, where God lives eternally with the saints in joy. Finally in the Gospel passage Jesus reveals that each believer will be a living temple where God dwells within. Each Sunday as we come to church we are 'coming home', foreshadowing the heavenly Jerusalem. The Church has always emphasised the importance of joining the rest of the community, the church, on Sundays, not as a way of filling up the benches but as a foretaste and promise of our final home.
