

THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C)

Sunday of the Word of God

Week Commencing 26th January 2025

The letter to the Hebrews contains the phrase, 'The word of God is alive and active', and I suggest we can see this in the two situations described in today's first reading and Gospel. The book of Nehemiah deals with the return from exile in Babylon and the resulting religious revival. Ezra doesn't curl up in a corner with the Law (note - individual reading of the Bible is still recommended), he reads out loud to a large crowd. Similarly Jesus reads the verses of Isaiah out loud to the people in the synagogue, and follows up with a brief homily. The Bible didn't just drop out of the sky, it was the Catholic Church which discerned, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, which writings were to be considered normative, canonical. Key to this discernment was the requirement that the writings had been regularly and widely proclaimed in the liturgy, the Mass as we now call it. The Church didn't gather to listen to novels, it was the word of God they desired. We therefore have a living discernment, the Church members guided by the Spirit recognised writings inspired by the same Spiri and learnt to live by them.
