In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus invites us once again to cast off all our worries and put our trust in him. He tells this simply by reminding us not to worry about the future, about security, about money and other things. After all, these things are just but passing, and someday might bring us to failure. As the prophet Isaiah points out, even if a mother forgets her child, God never will. And as St. Paul says: "he who did not spare his own Son but handed him over for us all, how will he not also give us everything else along with him?" (Rom 8:32).

If we think, however, that money, properties and pleasures in life are things which can give us security then we are blinded. In fact, we become more insecure if we have lots of them, and they won't give us a little peace. A person who puts his trust in mammon will always be anxious and worried.

For me, worrying is a result of a defective understanding of the purpose of life. We are not here just to accumulate things and become successful. What St. Teresa of Calcutta says make sense; "God called us to be faithful, not successful".

In his love and compassion, God promised that he will be with us until the end of time. So, no need to worry then.

Brothers and sisters, putting our trust in God, becoming faithful is a daily act. Let us then direct our lives into the right perspective by trusting God at all time. His providence is without limit, if only we believe. Our Father in heaven knows what we need before we ask him. When trials and difficulties comes, turn to God and he will answer you, just believe. Let us ponder upon this words of wisdom from St. Augustine: "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until it rest in you"!

The Season of Lent begins this coming Ash Wednesday, March 1<sup>st</sup>. It is a day of Fasting and Abstinence, and ashes will be distributed at all the Masses, which are as follows: 9:15am; 9:30am [Mersea]; 12:15; 7:30pm.
