Shakespeare wrote, "What's in a name? That which is called a rose by any other name would smell as sweet". True to a degree, though a bouquet of stinkwort doesn't have the same ring to it. 'Apostle' has a meaning which is conferred by Jesus himself. He chooses 12 from his disciples and calls them apostles, a name which means 'sent'. Ss.Peter and Paul were chosen by God and sent, sent to proclaim the Gospel and to guide and govern the church. So we can also understand why one of the key 'marks' of the true church is that it is Apostolic, because there needs to be continuity between what Ss.Peter and Paul and the other Apostles preached, and what is preached now by those called apostles today. Unfortunately there are many groupings around nowadays which claim to be churches and even put apostolic in their title, while what they teach as Gospel bears little resemblance to the true Gospel; they mislead many. Let us thank God for giving us true Apostles and for the fidelity of their successors down the ages (I appreciate that not all the successors have been paragons of virtue etc).

- Use the hand sanitiser provided on entrance and exit (*or your own*).
- 2 meters social distancing is to be observed at all times.
- Parish stewards and cleaners will be here to help and direct you.

MAKING A DONATION: Some parishioners have asked how they can continue to make their offerings during this period. This is much appreciated; our Parish needs your continued support at this time as Coronavirus has raised some very particular financial challenges for us. Not only do we have no plate and envelope collection, but we cannot hire out our parish hall either. We must, however, continue to pay for essentials such as our priest's living expenses, the upkeep of our buildings and other ongoing costs. Of course, we realise that the current situation is affecting many people's income and they may not be able to continue their level of offerings. If this is the case, we fully understand, and our prayers are with you. If you usually give by envelope or via cash in the collection, you can either make individual payments whenever you like by dropping envelope through Presbytery door, or you can set up a regular gift by Standing Order. This can be stopped at any time, for example, if you wish to resume giving by cash or envelope once Sunday Mass is resumed.
