The "Beatitudes", or the Sermon of the Mount, opens up the series of teachings in the Gospel of St. Matthew. In this account, Jesus called blessed the people whom the world called unlucky and unfortunate; they are the poor, those who mourn, the hungry and thirsty of righteousness, etc.

Accordingly for Jesus, the Beatitudes are sets of qualities a person needs today. If you notice, they are not easy to attain and much more difficult to practice. Their traits basically are against the tide of the world's affairs. Who wants for example to be poor, meek, humble, to go hungry or thirsty, to be persecuted or insulted. Definitely NO ONE!

However, if we look at it from the point of view of God, Beatitudes are keys by which he wants us to live our life. In addition, to help us understand further this teaching of Jesus on the Blessedness, the first and the second readings of this Sunday propose the necessary virtues to be practised.

Humility can therefore help a person to recognize who he really is in relation to God, to all his creation and to himself. It tells us how God wants us to live our life to the full. Man without God is nothing. And thus, he does not have any right at all to demand, or worse to go against his will, but rather to "follow". Before God, man must humble himself and recognize his power over him in many ways. In this way, in the eyes of God....we remain blessed forever. Finally, make up our mind and make a choice ourselves......Amen.
