### MISSION APPEAL NEXT SUNDAY BY THE COMBONI FATHERS

We recently celebrated the feast of St.Pius X, Pope from 1903-14. He faced the challenge of modernism, a "liberal" attitude which denied Revelation (so the bible ceases to have authority) and reduced faith to opinion. A century later and we see the same challenge. Increasingly people shop around for a religion which they are comfortable with and which they will still tailor to their own tastes. Sadly this attitude is common among those who claim to be Catholic. Today's readings remind us that the Catholic faith is one of revealed truth. In his letter to the Galatians, St.Paul very clearly states that the Gospel will save only if people continue to believe it, believing anything else will not lead to anything. Baptism is a Sacrament of faith, the creed is professed, and we reaffirm our faith each Sunday and Solemnity. It's worth thinking a moment about those words, 'believing anything else will not lead to anything'. Believing something else yet expecting this to lead to heaven doesn't add up. So we are called to adhere to the true faith and also to deepen our faith, to explore the riches of what God has revealed. And riches they are as we will find if we spend some time and effort in exploring the teaching of the Gospel. The modern catechism is a wonderful place to start. Fr.Chris

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

**Relaxation of Covid restrictions:** There will no longer be restrictions on group sizes for attending communal worship. Our collective challenge, as restrictions are lifting, is to make sure we all continue to keep ourselves and others as safe as possible. Please note the following changes that will be implemented:-

- ◆ There will be an expectation that face coverings are worn in the Church, as per the advice of the Government (*unless, of course, a person is exempt from doing so*).
- ◆ As Social distancing rules have changed there will no longer be Church Stewards at Mass guiding people to their seats, this means that people now have the option of choosing where they wish to sit.
- ◆ We will retain a section of the church roped off for those who wish to maintain the 2-metre social distancing.
- ◆ Weekday Masses have returned to their normal time of 9.30am with Morning Prayer at 9.15am.
- ◆ Entrance to Church will be via the main door (no one way system needed)
- ◆ The side door will remain open for ventilation and can be used for exiting if wished.
- ◆ Communion will remain under one kind.
- ◆ Sign of peace will remain not physical
- ◆ For the time being there will be no singing at Mass
- ◆ We will continue to supply hand sanitiser stations at entrance and side door.
- ◆ An Offertory Collection box will be situated at side door; the donation station in church porch is also useable
- ◆ There will be no restrictions on the number allowed to attend Funerals, Baptisms and Weddings

*Anyone displaying symptoms of Covid-19, or who has reason to believe that they have been in contact with someone who has, should not attend church or volunteer in any capacity until they have received medical advice that it is safe to do so.*
